say, "He has a demon'; the Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, "Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds."

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH- A Brief Statement of Faith
