On August 9, I will be preaching for Old First Church of Newark and their pastor, Rev. Dr. Betty Tom, will be preaching for Central. And we will both attend coffee hour at Central after worship that day. We believe it is good for our congregations to hear a variety of voices in preaching.

Rev. Dr. Betty Jean Tom was born and raised in Indianapolis, Indiana. Rev. Tom professed a saving hope in Jesus Christ and was baptized at the age of 12 while growing up in the New Liberty Baptist Church. Rev. Tom grew up serving in the church in various capacities and believes that she was, "born to serve God". The benchmarks of Rev. Tom's ministry are her desire to advocate for those who have no voice, her love for prayer, praise and worship, and the study of God's Word. The scripture that best informs Rev. Tom's ministry is Colossians 3:17, "and whatever you do in word or deed do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him."

Rev. Tom, formerly a teacher and school counselor in the Indianapolis Public School and Warren Township School districts for 22 years, holds a Doctor of Ministry from McCormick Theological Seminary, Chicago, IL, (2013); a Masters of Divinity from Christian Theological Seminary, Indianapolis, IN (2003); a Master of Science degree in Education from Butler University, Indianapolis, IN (1986); and a Bachelor of Science degree from Ball State University, Muncie, IN (1978). Rev. Tom has served churches in Indianapolis, New York and New Jersey (currently).

Rev. Tom is a lifelong learner, social justice advocate and spiritual leader. She is an active member of the National Association of Presbyterian Clergy Women, and serves on the advisory board for the Presbyterian Hunger Program. Rev. Tom has written articles, essays and devotionals for the Indianapolis Star Newspaper, Presbyterian Today magazine, PHP Post. She has conducted several seminars and workshops on women in ministry with an emphasis on ministry as a second vocation and mission oriented ministry.

Rev. Tom is a philanthropist, an avid football and basketball fan; she enjoys reading, writing, good jazz music, collecting books on prayer, water aerobics and swimming. Betty Tom is married to the Rev. Phil Tom and their blended family includes 6 children and a new grandson, Parker.



This program is part of *Connect Montclair*, an initiative born from our New Beginnings church renewal process started in 2015. Thanks to the efforts of Lauren Waisanen, Community Coordinator, we initiated a relationship with ARC. When their Park Street facility closed in 2018, we became a natural local partner for hosting their ongoing blood drives.

Stage I Plan and Next Steps


Session has appointed a task force to create protocols for re-opening our church buildings. The task force is composed of Scott Osborne, Mark Johansen, Kim O'Hare, Frederick Moulongo, and Pastor Noble. They are studying reports by health professionals, state and local governments, and guidelines from the Presbytery of Newark. Session has approved Stage 1 protocols which address the present use of buildings by staff and tenants. Buildings are currently closed for church members. But the task force is now working on Stage 2 guidelines that may begin to bring the congregation together for worship and small group gatherings. When these guidelines are done and approved by Session and Presbytery, they will be shared with everyone.

Continuing Education & Small Groups



Brief Meditation Wednesdays, 12:15 pm via Zoom

This small group experience began in June and will continue throughout the summer. The class explores a variety of practices including contemplative prayer, body prayer, and Taize singing. We see members of our church body taking personal inventory, seeking new tools, and connecting with others in meaningful ways. Treasurer's Report

For the month of June 2020, Central Church collected \$17,025 in revenue (including transfers from investment funds and interest income of \$7,253) and paid \$36,245 in expenses. Therefore, the church received \$19,400 less in revenue than it paid out in expenses. The money in the checking account increased to \$28,970 from \$19,950 at the end of May 2020 due a transfer from an investment account of \$25,000. Pledge income is substantially off of budget as is the income from projected Church Use - rent from Park Street Academy and IHN. June 2020 expenses are about \$7,000 less than the amount budgeted. Donations from the Special Offerings collected in May were paid out to the recipients (HNFP, Toni's Kitchen and OGHS).

The investment account balances are reflective of month-end June 2020 and have made gains over the past few months reclaiming much of the losses suffered in the beginning of the year.
