Central and COVID-19

In January of this year, the world began to learn about a new health threat in the form of a virus. At first we learned there was an outbreak in a city called Wuhan, in China. Then we heard about transmissions and losses of life outside of China. In mid-March, our communities of New Jersey, and more locally, Montclair, were called to local action. Community guidelines to combat the virus have gradually become more and more restrictive.

On Thursday, March 13, Session approved a motion to close our facilities to all events and gatherings until they deemed the spaces safe as a matter of public health. As of March 24, Session voted to keep the facilities closed for the foreseeable future. Session has been and plans to continue meeting every Tuesday to review the situation.

In the span of two weeks we mobilized to keep the life of the church – our members and friends – connected.

- 1) Worship moved to an on-line, live stream format (see details in the Worship updates)
- 2) We send out daily e-mails with pastoral messages of hope, calm, and restoration
- 3) Established Zoom video conference ability to shift staff and committee meetings
- 4) Community Movement Project trained on Zoom and shifted to offer classes from instructor's homes
- 5) Deacons created a shepherding plan to make sure our friends and members are kept in the loop and have an opportunity to share their needs, be heard, and stay connected

Staff and members have worked hard and collaborated well to make these things happen. It has long been a desire to grow our use of technology at Central. We simply did not envision it happening through a situation like this, on this timeline. Our first Live Stream worship service, March 22, had 457 views, and our March 29 video has 207 (as of today).

Session is mindful of the ways we can help others. They voted to continue the April Red Cross blood drive as a life-saving opportunity, incorporating enhanced precautions. Virtual Easter lilies will raise money for Toni's Kitchen.

Thank you to all who are stepping up to help us stay connected in this time. Now more than ever...



Two Opportunities to Give

During this Lenten Season, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, many of us are experiencing a lot of stress, confusion and perhaps fear for our families, our friends, our businesses and the world beyond.

Despite the fact that we are unable to worship together, we can still help others through two wonderful giving opportunities: the Virtual Lilies Project and One Great Hour of Sharing.

The Virtual Lilies Project

Since we will not be placing lilies around the chancel steps, the Deacons and the Mission Committee are asking CPC members and friends to donate the same amount you would have spent on lilies, with the donations distributed to Toni's Kitchen instead. Toni's Kitchen is a food ministry sponsored by St. Luke's Episcopal Church located in Montclair. On a weekly basis, Toni's kitchen feeds up to 100 guests four times per week without reference to their economic status. During the pandemic, Toni's is also donating groceries one day per week at the three Montclair school locations where free lunches are handed out to students.


The In-Choirer

Steeple Report

In March we conducted repairs to the steeple. What seemed a minor issue – a panel that shook loose and fell during a winter storm – had a very involved solution. Thanks to the Buildings & Grounds Committee and Building Manager Mark Schoonfield, for coordinating the restoration.

Treasurer's Report

For the month of February 2020, Central Church collected \$38,129 in revenue (including transfers from investment funds of \$9,603) and paid \$33,789 in expenses. Therefore, the church received about \$4,340 more in revenue than it paid out in expenses. The money in the checking account increased to \$107,760 as a \$50,000 check from the insurance company to start the steeple project was received but not yet paid to the vendor and a payroll glitch left an additional \$8,500 in the account. Pledge income was about \$2,600 less than budget. Money received was \$5,000 less than budget but remains ahead of YTD budget due to the strong January income. Actual expenses were about \$9,409 less than the amount budgeted.

Expenses were low this month for several reasons including timing issues reflected in the high January expenses from insurance and fuel costs. Please note, the Salary, Benefits & Taxes line is still understated, though the overdue benefit payment from January was included with the February payment. Due to an error by Paychex, the 2.28.20 payroll run excluded four employees for a total of about \$7,000 in salary and \$1,500 in tax payments. This error is in the process of being rectified.
