

Active "Agape" (Love)

I've been thinking for a while how the love of God is active, rather than passive. I think of Jesus going out of his way to love those who were usually ignored or avoided- the sick, the poor, the tax collectors, the prostitutes, even the dead. He didn't have a headquarters to which people came to him. He was not passive, but instead identified those in need and went to them to serve them. He said he was the kind of shepherd who would look for the lost or hurting sheep and minister to them as they needed him. And I think of the Lord's Supper where he promises to meet us where we are.

God's active love is so wide and deep, gathering up everyone and leaving no one behind. That can be kind of shocking if we look around and realize no matter who we see, they are loved by God. That takes some work sometimes—to set aside my feelings or beliefs or positions, or even more so, looking beyond someone else's feelings, beliefs and positions—and remembering God loves them as much as me.

And that can make me squirm. If they are loved by God, then who am I to hold back? If God reaches out to them with love so can I. If God sacrifices, as Jesus did, on their behalf, then maybe I can move toward them with a love that aims to be active rather than passive. With life springing up all around us this time of year, it seems like an especially good time to put our love to work by reaching farther than usual to share the deep and wide love of God.

Affirming Justice & Reconciliation



On Sunday, April 25th, we gathered outside the church for an informal installation of new banners. During this brief gathering volunteers worked in teams to lift and secure each banner in place. We held a short service in gratitude for this step of affirmation for diversity and inclusion. We closed in prayer with a call for readiness for the work that is before us – that "it will not always be easy to take the right steps – may God guide us and support us along the way".

This project was sparked by several members of the congregation who wrote to Session. The request was to consider how we, as a church, would be engaging with this time of "intense and widespread examination of inequality and injustice". In a carefully considered response, Session moved to develop a message we could share with our community in the form of banners to hang outside our sanctuary.

We mailed a letter to our congregants with a full Statement to Our Congregation and Community on Justice and Reconciliation From the Session of Central Presbyterian Church. The letter is available on our website home page at www.centralpresbyterian.net.









Mission Trip Shares



The Session has given permission to the youth group to raise funds toward this summer's mission trip. They will be staying at and working with Camp Johnsonburg, from June 27 to July 1 and they will be doing whatever is needed to prepare the camp for summer. The cost is \$300 per youth- equally divided between the youth, the youth group budget, and fundraising within the congregation.

The youth group plans to raise funds by selling shares in the mission trip. That means church members are invited to donate whatever amount they wish toward the mission trip and the donors will be thanked in a unique way—the youth group will be asking for a photo of each donor that will be printed on a banner that the group will display at each work site during the week. A photo of the group, the banner, and the worksite will then be distributed to the donors by email and to the congregation via our website as a way of saying, "thank you."

Donations can be sent to the church office, marked "Shares." Or donations can be dropped off at Sunday outdoor afternoon worship services. You will be contacted for a photo. Thank you for your generosity!
